Snapper Classic May 2026

The Snapper Classic, held over the weekend of 30-31 May, delivered outstanding reef fishing and plenty of excitement for all involved.

A total of 25 anglers took part in the competition, with some exceptional snapper landed across the weekend. Thanks to our sponsors for making this competition possible:



Between competitors, 19 snapper measuring over 50cm were caught, 12 fish over 60cm and one impressive snapper measuring over 70cm.

Many of the larger snapper were photographed on the measure mat before being released to swim another day, which was great to see.

The longest snapper caught on bait measured an impressive 755mm and the longest on a lure went 641mm. The junior and small fry anglers also had a fantastic showing, with snapper measuring 680mm and 615mm taking out their sections of the competition.

Fish frames were also collected as part of the NSW DPI Research Angler Program. All legal length frames are valuable and help support this important research. The program collects data that contributes to ensuring quality recreational fishing opportunities continue for favourite species into the future.

As part of this work, the earbones, or otoliths, are used to determine the age of the fish. This age data helps build a picture of the age structure of snapper populations, showing how many fish there are of each age in the stock. Over time, this information helps evaluate the health of the species and track how fish populations in NSW may be changing. Overall, it was a brilliant weekend of fishing and a great event for everyone who took part.

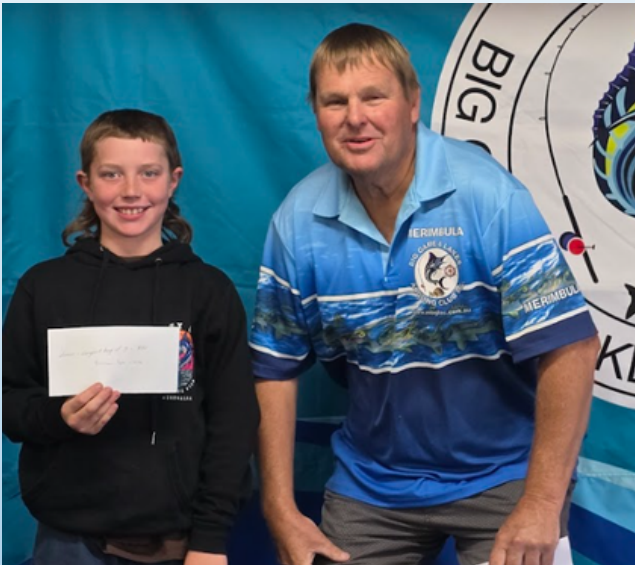

We Want Your Fish Frames!



You can help us by donating your Mulloway, Snapper, Kingfish, Dusky Flathead, Blue Spotted Flathead, Pearl Perch, Bar Cod, Bass Groper, Spanish and Spotted Mackerel fish frames.

How to get involved

Donate your frames at tackle store drop-off points (see over back for details) and include:


- Who - name and contact details (phone number, postal and/or email address)
- When - date the fish was caught
- Where - approximate location and whether the fish was caught in an estuary, from shore (rocks, beach, breakwall) or offshore.

What do we do?

A range of biological data is recorded from your fish, including the age which is obtained through extracting otoliths (ear bones). This data contributes to ensuring continued quality recreational fishing opportunities for your favourite species into the future.

What does the angler receive?

Not only do you get a great feed from your fish as well as contributing to citizen science, but you'll receive a certificate with the age of your fish as well as go into our prize draw!

Fish Cleaning Pontoon UPDATE

Our fish cleaning pontoon has now been BACK IN THE WATER for approximately 5 months and immediately saw fishos utilising it for fish cleaning.

This project has taken a mammoth effort, from getting a crane to remove it from its resting place at top lake, to transport costs to and from Broadwater Engineering to undergo repairs by South Coast Hire and Sapphire Coast Cranes. Wilson's signs were involved in updating all the signage and Eden Slipways completed the new mooring, chains and concrete blocks that had disappeared into the sand bed whilst the pontoon was out of the water.

There were also some additional repairs required after vandals let the pontoon loose from the boat ramp while it was waiting to be taken back to its mooring spot.

The MBGLAC is incredibly grateful to those who donated to assist in getting the pontoon back in the water - South Coast Hire and Pambula Motorfest. The donation of funds and services has helped meet the costs associated with returning the pontoon in working order. Half of the maintenance was funded by the Bega Valley shire Council as part of the agreement between the MBGLAC and them. The remainder, except for a couple of thousand will be covered by Transport NSW Boating Infrastructure Maintenance Grant.

In addition to the funds required, it takes the time of volunteer members to coordinate grant applications, assist with the moving of and coordination of different services, resulting in hours of work.

The annual Grudge Match between Eden, Pambula and Merimbula fishing clubs took place over the weekend of May 15 - 17th. Pambula were our hosts this year and we all came together for a friendly BBQ lunch.

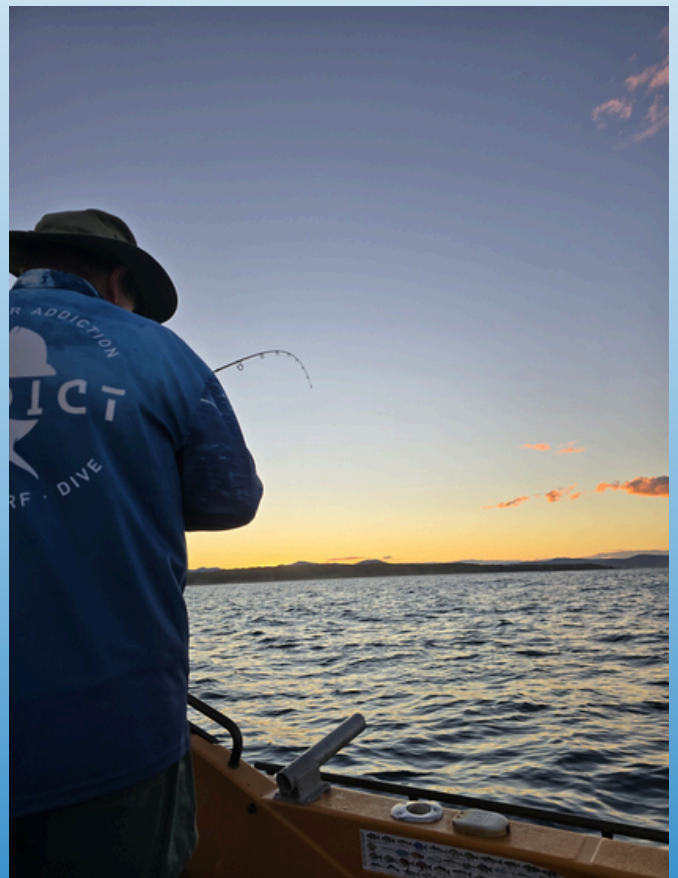

Game Fish Tagging Program

Reminder to Return Tag Cards!

The Game Fish Tagging Program is the largest saltwater tagging program of its kind in the world and has been in operation since 1973.

It is used to obtain information on the biology (distribution, movement, growth, exploitation) of billfish, tunas, sharks and sport fish and encourages game fishers to participate in the management of the fishery.

This is a great time to remind all anglers and boats to return their completed tag cards to their local game fishing club or directly back to the tagging program. All tag cards have a replied paid on the back so they can simply be placed into your closest mailbox. Alternatively, completed tag cards can be emailed to gamefish.tagging@dpird.nsw.gov.au

A big thank you to all those anglers and clubs who have been promptly submitting their tag cards! We are still awaiting the original release information for many recaptured fish from both this season and past seasons. Please have a look around and send back your completed cards, even if they are several years old as they may still match up with a recaptured fish that is in the database. The data and information on every individual tag card plays an important role in understanding the movement and distribution of game fish and pelagic species.
